Saturday, April 26, from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. at Highland Park McDonald’s, located at 14124 Woodward Avenue.

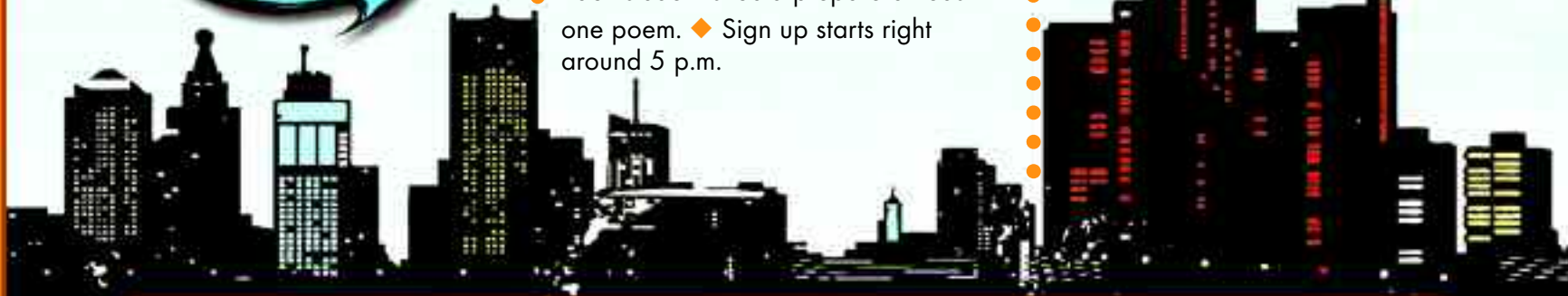
